

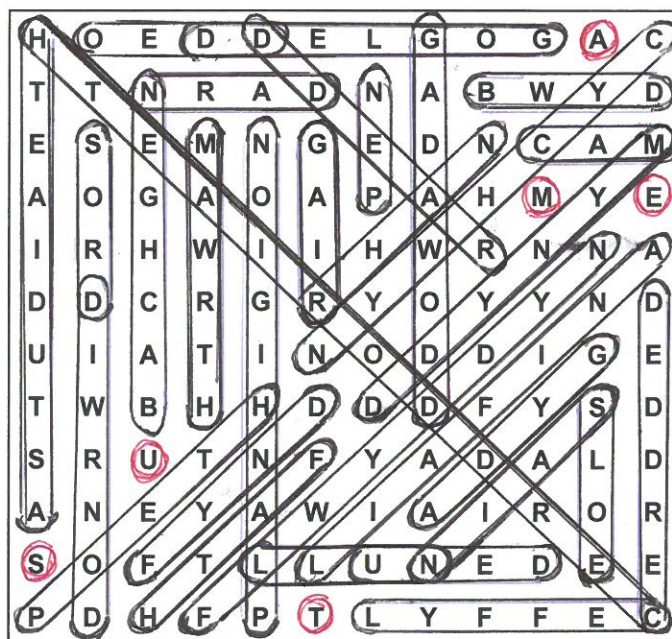
Chwilair Gymraeg

In the month that St David's day falls, here's a Wordsearch for you that is appropriately in Welsh (but with the English equivalent in brackets purely for interest as the English words aren't part of the Wordsearch).

All the words in the columns below can be found with the table. They may be horizontal, vertical or diagonal and some are written backwards.

Once you have found all the words, there will be six letters unused. When read from left to right these spell out two three-letter words which ask a question in Welsh that is very important to our Health and Well Being.
